Cymatics

Imagine a world where a simple sound could cause things to happen. Imagine playing a song on a piano, or even on a drum set, and images being magically created. While many of you may think that this, making images from sound, is impossible, it has already been done and the study of this "visible sound" or "wave phenomena" is called Cymatics.

While this kind of innovation may seem new, the roots of this study called Cymatics started in 1680 with scientist Robert

Hooke. (You may recognize him for naming the small units of life

"cells.") Afterwards, throughout



history, more people experimented with Cymatics, including Ernst Chladni and Hans Jenny. Now, people such as the German photographer, Alexander Lauterwasser, as well as music artist, Nigel John Stanford, continue to carry on the history of this interesting study of Cymatics.

Face Hacking Have you ever wondered if you can change your look automatically, without makeup. This is possible though project mapping, also called video mapping.



This is a technology that uses 3-D images as a video projection. Asai a Japanese CGI expert digitally changed his workers' faces in real time, while they were moving.

Along with team of developers, Asai has believed to have created a face tracking/projection technology for future Face Hacking. The face transformation process happens when two people are sitting with their tracking dots on their faces. Next, the software digitally maps their faces and begins to project new faced on their old. With their eyes closed a black mask projects on their faces, as they turn their heads, their faces can change to a robotic image face, a cheetah face and so on.
